- 1 teaspoon dried dandelion leaves
- 1 teaspoon dried nettle leaves
- 1 teaspoon dried calendula petals
- 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1 teaspoon dried peppermint leaves
- 1 teaspoon honey
- Mason Jar

This method allows for a more thorough extraction of the plant's properties, resulting in a brew that not only tastes richer but also carries a higher concentration of magickal and health benefits compared to a simple steeped cup of tea. Thus, infusing often yields a more potent and flavorful beverage that harnesses the full potential of the plant ingredients.
